East Perth Station Upgrade out-of-hours works

To continue work on the East Perth Station Upgrade, out-of-hours work is required as follows:

- **Monday 14 August, 9pm to Tuesday 15 August, 5am**
- **Friday 18 August, 7pm to Sunday 20 August, 7am**
- **Sunday 20 August to Thursday 24 August, 10pm to 5am each night**
- **Friday 1 September, 7pm to Monday 4 September, 5am.**

This work is required to take place during these hours to prevent excessive disruption to Midland Line services and ensure the safety of our passengers and the general public. The purpose of these night works is:

- Delivery and unloading of rail into the East Parade Car Park
- Commission and put into service the new station platform
- Decommission and removal of existing temporary platform to the south
- Partial decommissioning and disassembling of the existing platform
- Opening of new temporary platform to the north
- Bulk excavation to the south of the station
- Installation of OLE Masts
- Signalling work
- Installation and fit-out of island canopy roof.

All works will follow an approved Noise Management Plan, however some disturbance is unavoidable. If you feel there is excessive noise during these works, please contact the **Site Supervisor directly on 0428 358 569**. This allows them to immediately review the source of the noise and if possible, put mitigation measures in place.
